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**Item 8.01 Other Events.**

The shareholder derivative complaint, *Plumbers & Pipefitters Local No. 572 Pension Fund v. Probst, et al.*, which Electronic Arts Inc. ( EA ) previously reported in a Current Report on Form 8-K filed on August 10, 2006, alleging purported improprieties in EA s issuance of stock options, has been voluntarily dismissed by the plaintiff. On September 14, 2006, the court signed an order dismissing the complaint. No compensation was paid by EA to the plaintiff or its attorneys, and each side has agreed to bear its own attorneys fees.

On September 14, 2006, EA received an informal inquiry from the Securities and Exchange Commission requesting certain documents and information relating to EA s stock option grant practices from January 1, 1997 to the present. EA intends to cooperate with all matters related to this request.
