PROXY STATEMENT/PROSPECTUS EN ROUTE TO EMPLOYEE SHAREOWNERS

As the March 19 shareowner vote approaches, some employees have submitted questions to [HP's internal web site] asking why they have not yet received their proxy statement/prospectus in the mail. In response to these inquiries, HP Internal Communications would like to ensure that employees are informed about the mailing timeline.

All HP shareowners of record at the close of business on January 28, 2002, are entitled to vote on the merger. HP began mailing the proxy statement/prospectus to these shareowners on February 6.

Employee shareowners of record who reside in the United States should allow at least two weeks for delivery, while those who reside outside the United States should allow at least three weeks for delivery.

Many HP employee shareowners may hold HP shares in a third party bank or brokerage account, or in a proprietary investment account such as a 401(k) plan. In these cases, HP mailed the proxy statement/prospectus to the banks or brokers, or to the trustees or administrators of the investment accounts, who then forward it to the HP employee shareowners who hold HP shares in those accounts. As a result, these employee shareowners may not receive the proxy statement/prospectus for several weeks.
